SUPPLIES

If you have an Advent wreath, the devotional included in this packet has devotions for every day of Advent and includes instructions for how to incorporate the different candles of the Advent wreath each day. If you don't have a wreath, you can use the candle included in your kit (or any other candle!) to light when you use the devotional.

Besides a wreath or candle, all you need for devotions is a Bible. If you have younger children, feel free to use a Children's Bible for the stories in the devotional. Most of these stories will appear in a typical children's Bible storybook!

BUILDING A NEW HABIT

If your family does not currently have spiritual practices / devotions built into the habits of your day, this may be challenging at first. I recommend that you attach this routine to a habit or ritual you already have as a family, like dinner or bedtime.

INCLUDING CHILDREN

Give each child a role in the devotions each night. One may be responsible to gather the family each evening, another may light and extinguish the candles, others may take turns or share parts of the reading of the Scripture, etc.

FREEDOM FROM PERFECTION

Building new traditions will rarely unfold perfectly - the idyllic image you may have in your mind for family devotions may devolve into chaos when you upset the natural rhythms of individualism in family life! Have grace for yourself and have grace for your kids, and trust that God's light and presence can minister to your family even in the imperfections. I pray this practice will be a refreshing experience for your family!


